 - a. Motion to approve.
2. Finance and Membership report – Robert Hasserjian on behalf of Carlos Bueso-Ramos (5 min)
 - a. Main revenue comes from membership dues and workshop.
 - b. Memberships are up to 580 increasing revenues
 - c. Expenses are higher in workshop years. There was a net profit in 2021 from workshop

 - ii. 332 positive evaluations
 - iii. Well attended for virtual meeting
 - b. ASCP 2021 and 2022 SH Companion Meetings – Stefania Pittaluga, presented by Rob Hasserjian
 - i. Hybrid meeting w/ 24 live attendees, 25 on-demand
 - ii. Expect better attendance if held in conjunction with main meeting
 - iii. Very good evaluations
 - iv. (2) 90-minute blocks for 2022. Waiting to hear if it will be in-person or hybrid. Jim to follow-up.
 - c. EAHP “2020” Workshop (rescheduled April 2021) and EAHP 2022– John Goodlad
 - i. EBMWG 2022 course in Lund, Sweden May 28th-31st
 - ii. EAHP 2022 September 17-22 in Florence, Italy

- iii. Special education session to summarize current proposals for classifications. Day 2 bone marrow symposium. Day 3-5 lymphoma symposium. Day 5-6 Lymphoma Workshop.

 - d. SH 2021 Workshop – Ahmet Dogan and Mariusz Wasik, presented by Dr Czader
 - i. 250 cases w/ at least 2 specimens submitted each
 - ii. Sandeep Dave from Data Driven Bioscience analyzed cases for workshop
 - iii. “Primer” presentations offered basics of topics to be presented ahead of time
 - iv. Organized into 9 sessions and 2 corporate symposia
 - v. Income from registration surpassed \$350,000
 - vi. Currently working on 6-7 workshop summary papers to be published in the AJCP
 - e. SH 2023 Workshop – Francisco Vega
 - i. Will be hosted by MD Anderson in Houston, TX at the Hyatt Regency Houston
 - ii. Focus of workshop: Progress in Peripheral T- & NK- Cell Lymphomas: Diagnosis, Biomarkers, and Molecular Pathogenesis
 - iii. 15 minutes from the airport and near the theater district
- 4. Committee Reports (15 min)
 - a. Education Committee Update – Alexa Siddon
 - i. Annual program directors meeting topic on coagulation testing for hematopathology fellows
 - ii. Started having one fellow on the committee – Aishwarya Ravindran from Mayo
 - iii. Interactive Education Modules led by Elizabeth Courville are most popular educational initiative with 5 currently on the website.
 - iv. Grand Rounds Webinar Series: Four in 2021 led by Nadine Aguilera. Four are scheduled for 2022

 - i. 3 publications from 2021, 4 planned for 2022
 - ii. Cases are still being accepted and can be emailed to Julie

 - i. Promotes SH activities through social media, most actively on Twitter using #SHQuickbytes
 - ii. Cross-posted on FB, Instagram, and LinkedIn

 - d. Experimental Hematopathology Committee – Chris Park, presented by Jim Cook

- i. Mission is to promote science and research in hematopathology.

 - iii. Scientific Session during USCAP 2023 and Bi-annual workshop
- 5. Classification updates (10 min)
 - a. International Consensus Classification – Dan Arber
 - i. 149 participants met virtually in September 2021 to develop International Consensus Classification of Myeloid and Lymphoid Neoplasms.
 - b. WHO 5th edition – Megan Lim
 - i. Goals – evidence based classifications, enable worldwide research, timely synthesis of the evidence, based on expert consensus review or reproducible, peer-reviewed published data
 - ii. 5th Edition: 31 standing members, almost 200 expert editors, over 1600 authors, 35 countries represented
 - iii. 5th Edition Haematolymphoid Blue Book – 25 expert editors, 380 authors, 31 countries represented

 - a. Berard-Dorfman Award: Young Investigator (10 yrs or less since fellowship training) winner is Benjamin H. Durham. Senior Leadership (mid career – senior level) winner is Marsha Kinney
